LAST CHANCE

'Out of Bounds: Japanese Women Artists in Fluxus'

Through Jan. 21 at the Japan Society, 333 East 47th Street, Manhattan; japansociety.org.

By focusing on four revolutionary women — Shigeko Kubota, Takako Saito, Mieko Shiomi and Yoko Ono — who were at the heart of the Fluxus movement in the 1960s, this show asks: Who stands the test of time? Who doesn't? Was Fluxus really a blueprint for the future? The exhibition, organized by Midori Yoshimoto and Tiffany Lambert, with Ayaka Iida, features around 150 objects, which range from boxes full of curious objects to videos, films and photographs.
