Japan Society 2025 Annual Dinner Frequently Asked Questions

How much of my contribution is tax-deductible?

Amounts in excess of \$2,460 per table of 10 or \$246 per individual ticket is tax-deductible. You will receive a tax receipt following the dinner reflecting the actual number of tickets used.

How many guests will be seated at each table?

There are 10 seats per table.
